Below is an example of an English long-term plan for writing across the school. Our text choices can differ from the ones identified, due to the cohort, their needs and interests. Additionally, some texts are chosen to support the children in their personal development.

From the texts, we plan writing experiences to ensure our children have the opportunity to write for a purpose and audience; developing clear progression across the year.

Cycle A	The Smartest Giant In Town – Julia Donaldson	Descriptive sentences, sentence punctuation, speech bubbles, character descriptions, letters, poetry, non-chronological reports. Oracy Opportunities- book talk, conversations between characters, discussion about a famous author.
	Hibernation Hotel - John Kelly (Local Author)	Adjectives and conjunctions for descriptive sentences, research and non-chronological reports, predictions, retell a familiar story. Oracy Opportunities- book talk, role play, verbal retelling, fact sharing

	Horrid Henry – Francesca Simon	Empathetic Diary Entry, Comparison Character Descriptions, Writing Dialogue, play script features for a further scene.
